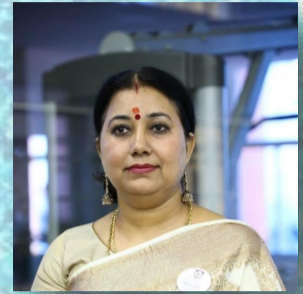

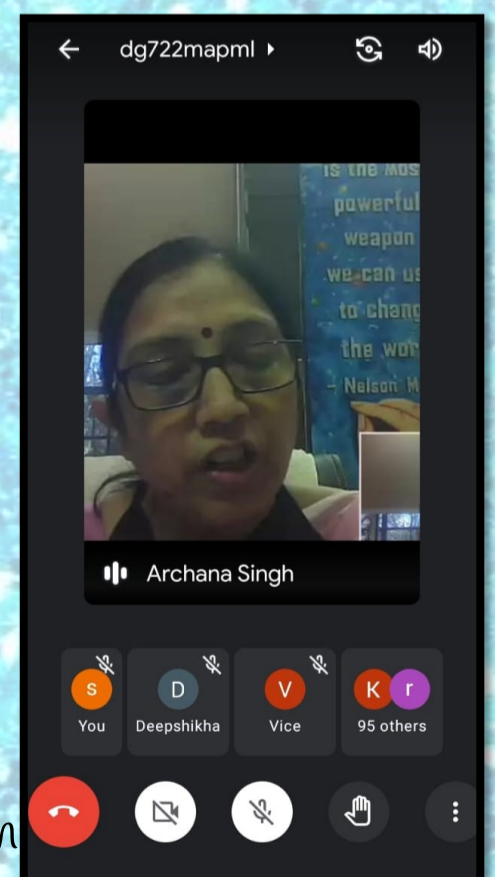
Greetings On Various Events

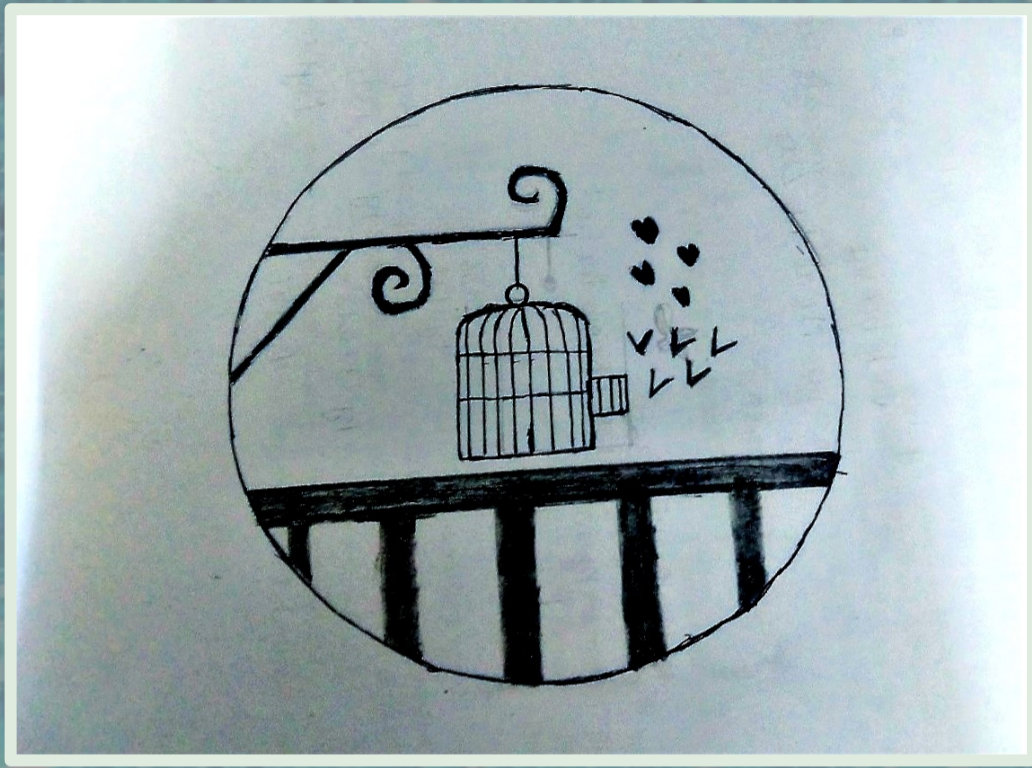
Climate Change & Environment Protection

Climate change is a direct threat to a child's ability to survive, grow and thrive. As extreme weather events such as cyclones and heat waves increase in frequency and ferocity, they threaten children's lives and destroy infrastructure critical to their wellbeing. Floods compromise water and sanitation facilities, leading to diseases such as cholera, to which children are particularly vulnerable. Draughts and changing global rainfall patterns are leading to crop failures and rising food prices, which for poor means food insecurity and nutritional deprivations that can have the potential to destroy livelihoods, drive migration, and conflict and cripple opportunities for children and young people .

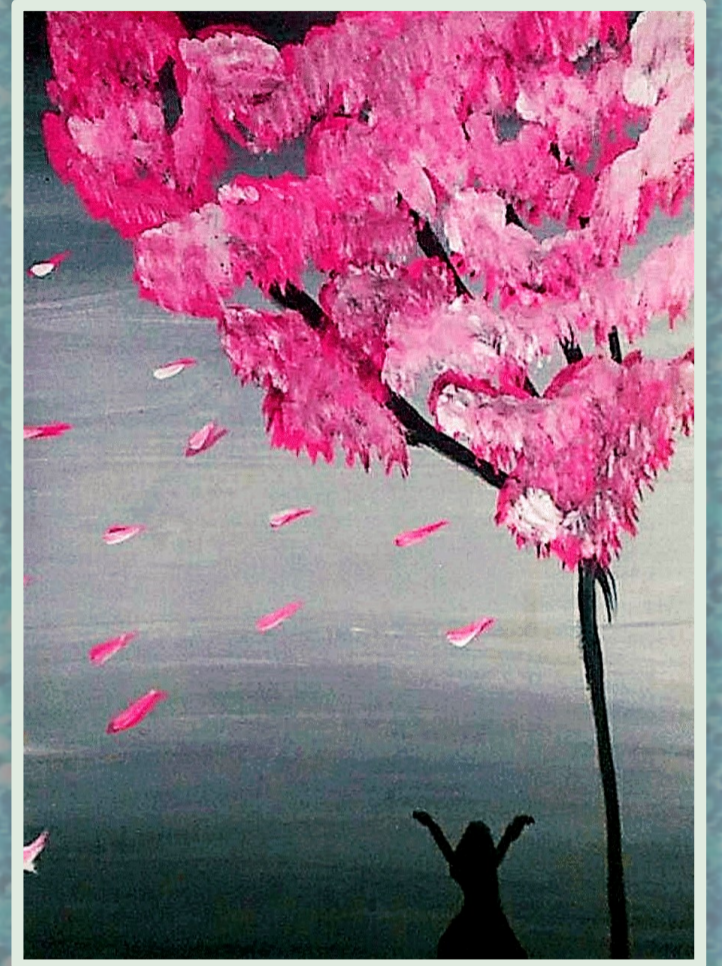
Children are the most vulnerable to diseases that will become wide spread as a result of climate change, such as malaria, dengue and fever, close to 90 % of the burdens of disease attribute to climate change is borne by children under the age of 5. The drivers of air pollution levels exceed standards set by the World Health Organization (WHO) causing them to breathe toxic air and putting their health and brain development at risk. Every year, over half a million children under the age of 5 die from air pollution related causes. Even more suffer lasting damage to their developing brains and lungs. Pneumonia remains the leading infectious cause of death among children under nutrition, lack of safe water and sanitation, indoor air pollution and inadequate access to health care – all challenges that are exaggerated by climate change.

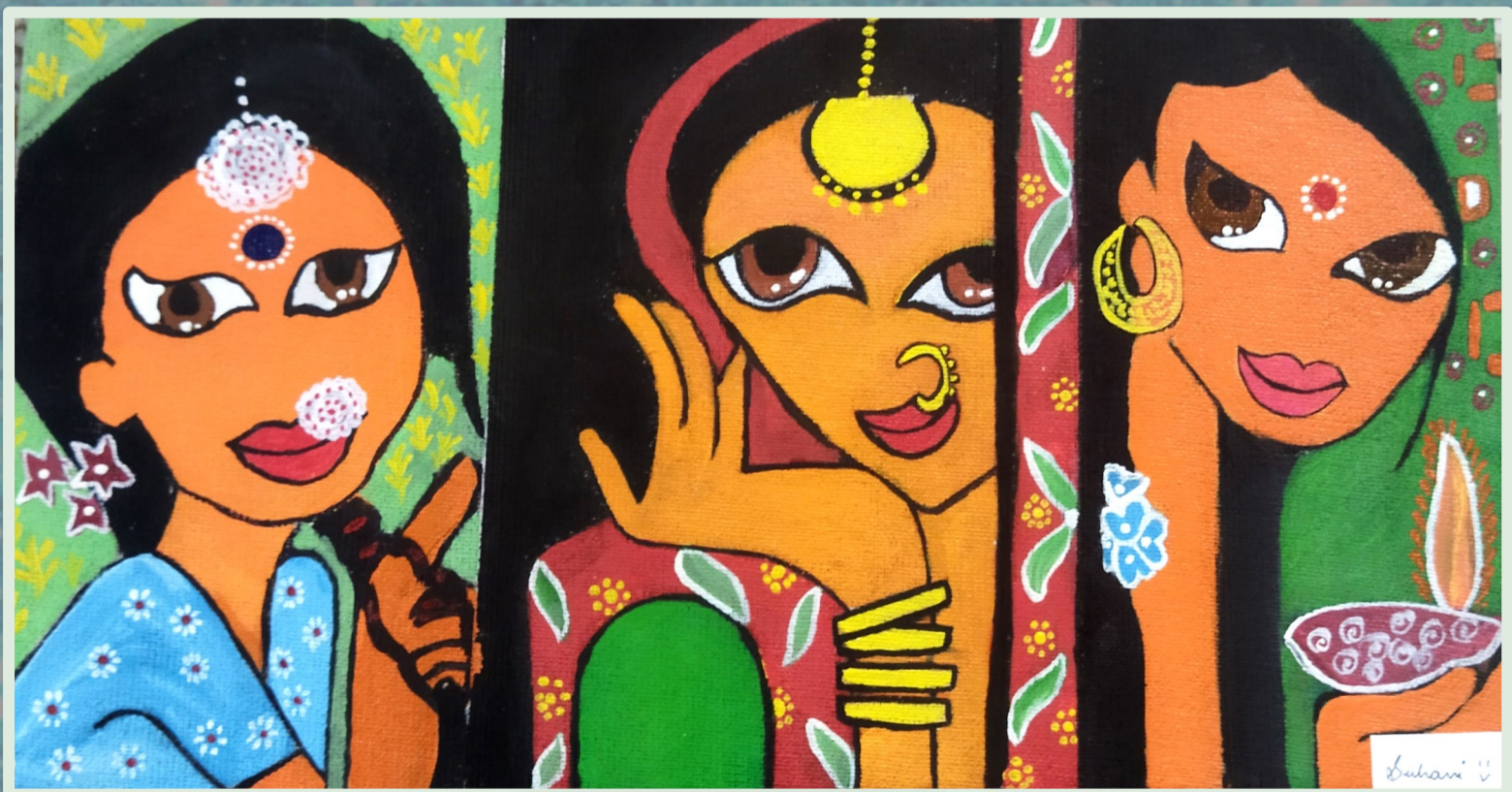

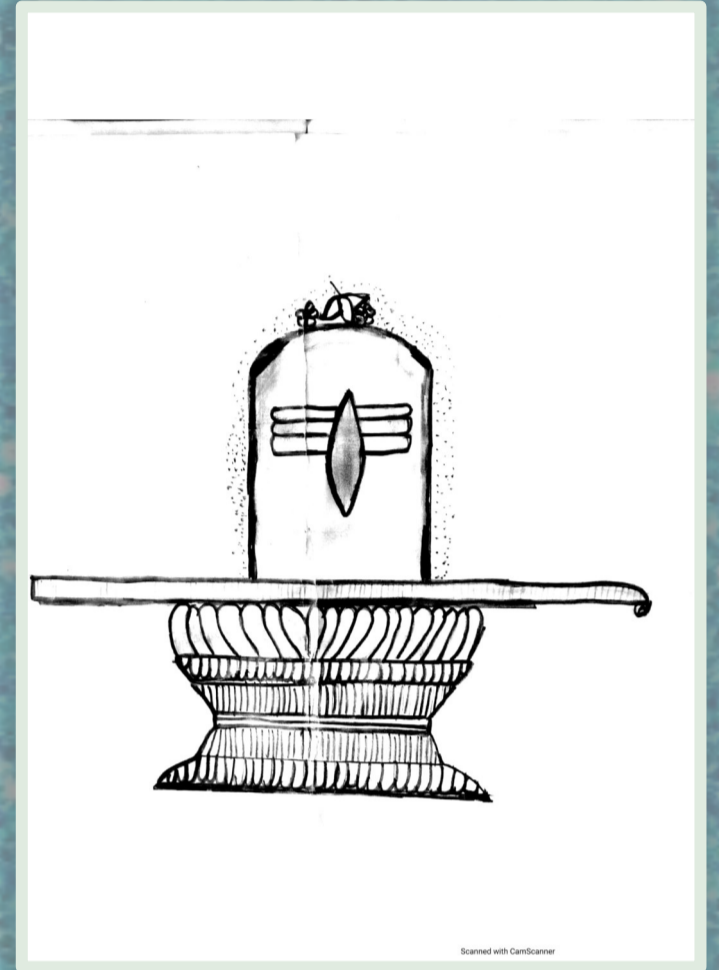

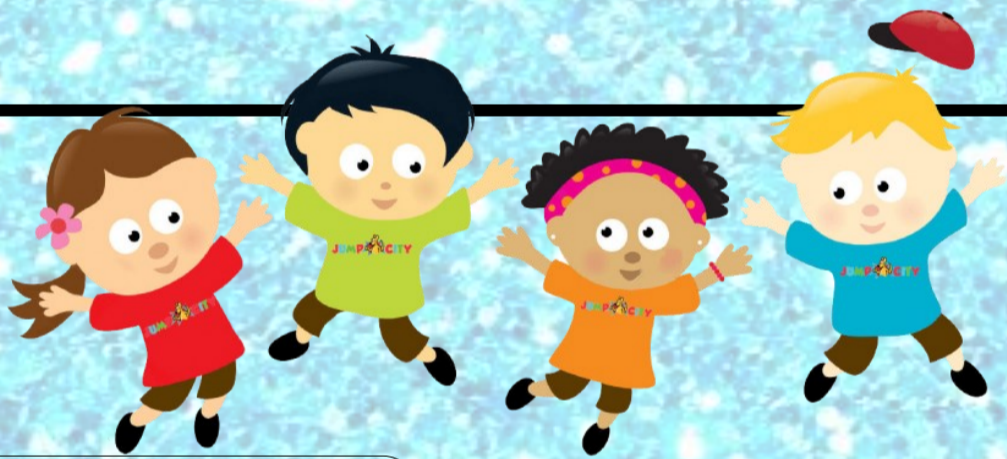
