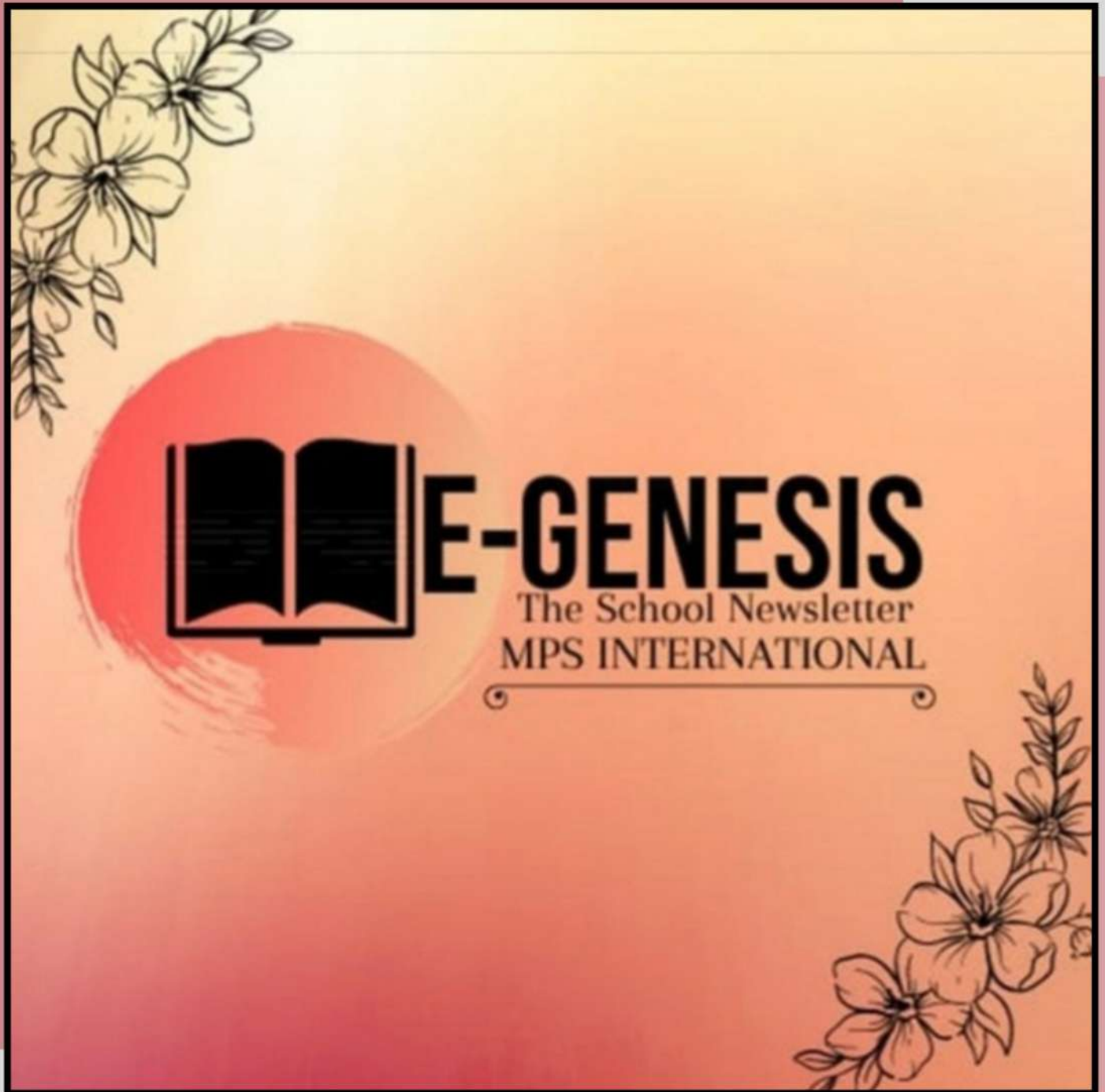

With the right guidance, they will grow more confident, responsible, and capable of achieving their goals.

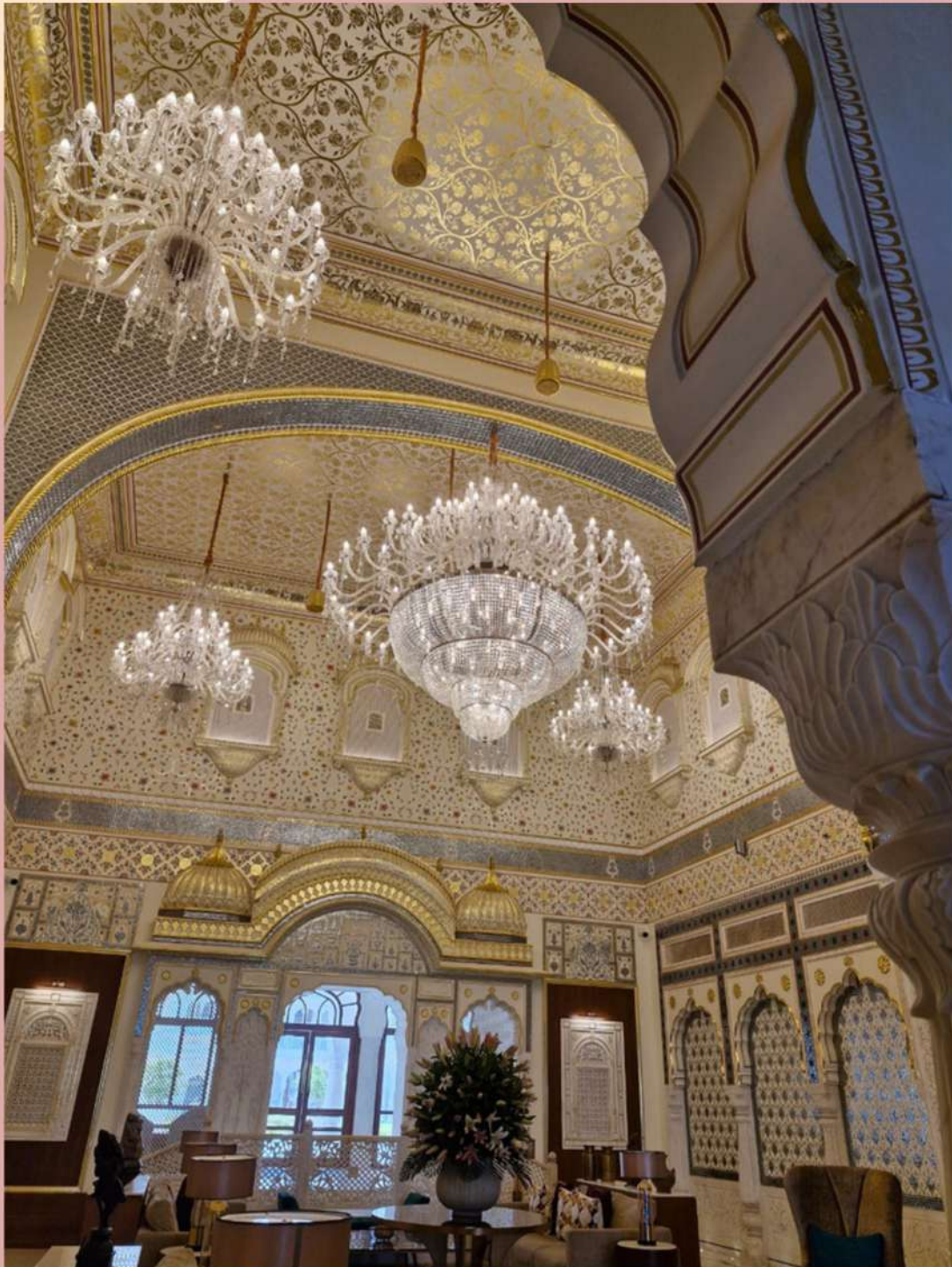

Careers in International Relations



OCS

1. Diplomat (IFS Officer)

Diplomats represent India in other countries and manage political, economic, and cultural relations. They negotiate agreements and help maintain strong international ties. They often work in embassies and travel globally.

They also assist Indian citizens abroad and handle emergencies like evacuations. This role requires strong decision-making, diplomacy, and communication skills.

Importance: They maintain peace, handle international conflicts, and protect India's interests worldwide.

Starting Salary: ₹10–15 LPA



2. International Relations Analyst

They study global issues, foreign policies, and political trends to provide insights. They work in think tanks, research bodies, or government organizations. Their reports guide important decisions.

They may specialize in specific regions or global issues like security or trade. Strong research and analytical skills are essential in this field.

Importance: They help governments and organizations make informed global strategies.

Starting Salary: ₹4–8 LPA



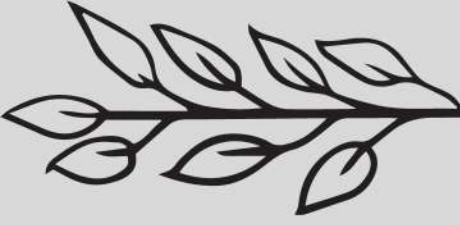
3. United Nations (UN) Officer

6. Policy Advisor (Foreign Affairs)

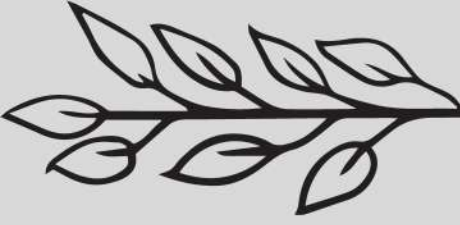
They advise governments or organizations on foreign policies and international strategies. Their role includes research, planning, and policy formulation. They work closely with decision-makers.

7. International Business Consultant

9. Intelligence Analyst

They track international developments and predict potential risks to national security. Strong analytical thinking and attention to detail are essential.

VOCABULARY

Loquacious – tending to talk a great deal; very talkative

Sycophantic – behaving in an excessively flattering way to gain advantage

Alloof – emotionally distant; not friendly or forthcoming

Jargon – specialized vocabulary used by a particular field or group

Pragmatic – dealing with things sensibly and realistically

Conspicuous – clearly visible or attracting notice

Laconic – using very few words in speech or writing

Verbal Reinforcement Method

Step 1:

Read the topic carefully to understand key concepts, focusing on meaning rather than memorization, and highlight only important points.

Step 2:

Explain the topic aloud in simple terms as if teaching someone, which helps identify gaps and improve understanding.

Step 3:

Write down everything remembered in an unstructured way using keywords or brief points to strengthen memory through active recall.

Step 4:

Compare your recall with the material, identify mistakes, and add missing points to improve accuracy.

Step 5:

Summarize the topic within a short time to enhance clarity, speed, and exam readiness.
